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Minutes - Board of Directors

The Springs Community Association, Inc. Clubhouse - 400 Woodbridge Road Longwood, FL Wednesday, August 21, 2019



Board members present were: Jerry Alexandrowicz, President, Jerry Crews, Vice President, Sherri Barwick, Treasurer, Chris Culberson, Secretary, Mim Starr and Austin Beeghly, Directors. Sentry Management VP Leigh Quinn, David Forthuber former Community Association Manager, Bob Carney Community Association Manager. Six home owners attended.

CALL TO ORDER

Noting that the meeting had been properly posted and a quorum was present, Board President Jerry Alexandrowicz called the meeting to order at 7pm.

PRESIDENT's REPORT

Jerry Alexandrowicz discussed plans to meet with Donny Saxon to continue the on-going discussion regarding the potential purchase by The Springs of the piece of property owned by Mr. Saxon which abuts The Springs property. A diagram of the property was displayed and the potential that this property represents was discussed. Meeting to be conducted during the week of August 26-30. Results will be presented at the next Board Meeting.

Mr. Alexandrowicz recognized the contributions to the community made by out-going CAM, David Forthuber and welcomed the incoming CAM, Bob Carney.

SECRETARY'S REPORT – Chris Culberson moved to approve the July 17, 2019 minutes. Austin Beeghly seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

TREASURERS REPORT - Sherri Barwick noted:

- A total of 105 homes owe assessments
 - A homes have been sent to the Attorney (plus 4 bad debt bankruptcies monitored)
 - 0 9 home have had liens filed against them
 - \diamond 20 home have had intent to lines filed
 - 0 68 homes are currently making scheduled payment
- 7 Homes sold during June. 2019 total is 44 sales YTD
- Financial Standing as of July 31st:
 - ◊ Operating Account \$1,260,443
 - ◊ Reserve Account \$918,641
 - ◊ Accounts Receivable Total \$146,888 down from June's \$177,060
 - ◊ Total Income YTD \$1,006,291, exceeds budget by \$31,331
 - ◊ Total Expenses YTD \$91,641, under budget by \$56,319
- Requested information concerning interest rates earned on the various accounts and current CD/MM interest which is available to the community for investment. Sentry to provide rate information.

MANAGERS REPORT – Bob Carney provided the manager's report which described the month's activities.

- Woodbridge Bridge Renovations: The Board selected Rustic Red (SW7593) as the preferred color for the bridge work.
- AP Wilson has been notified. An update will be provided from AP Wilson.
- Shrub installation on Springside Road Walls: installation including irrigation completed.
- Seminole Asphalt began installing new speed humps in the community on August 21st.
- Road Repairs: The Board requests additional quotes from vendors familiar with the installation of the thermoform PVC liners.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Architectural Control – Nothing to Report Audit – Information provided during Treasurer's Report Security – Chris Culberson reported the committee continues to examine options for Gate maintenance and for access control software. Detail provided under New Business Item 6

OPEN FORUM

- Ron Boyer requested that the newly installed speed bumps be enlarged to slow the vehicle traffic on Wisteria
- MOTION: Sherri Barwick made a motion requesting a traffic study which would study all forms of traffic in The Springs and make recommendation to improve safety of the residents. The motion was seconded by Austin Beeghly and it passed unanimously.
- Asher Wildman requested that The Springs consider use of an unmarked sheriff's vehicle to catch speeders
- Asher Wildman volunteered that he would supply the Board with all of the information he has obtained from the St. John's Water Authority.
- Christmas Luminarios. A request was made to explore the costs associated with the installation of luminarios . Austin Beeghly to provide possible dates for inclusion in the Social Committee calendar.

OLD BUSINESS

Proposed Regulation No. 21 – Use of Golf Carts: The Board discussed the information provided by the Attorney. *Sherri Barwick made a motion to adopt Regulation 21 as provided by Attorney Arias with his final change included. Austin Beeghly seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.*

Security Uniforms – The Board discussed the need to update the existing security uniforms. Management and Security work together and will supply the Board with prototypes of the uniform to include a shirt with necessary logos and identification and pants. The Board to discuss again during the September BOD Meeting.

NEW BUSINESS

Members Only Garage Sale: Austin Beeghly presented the concept of a members only garage sale to be hosted inside the community. Individual homeowners will be able to present items that they wish to sell by placing them in their driveway or carport. A listing addresses who will be participating and items to be sold will be developed and distributed via a separate Facebook Page associated with only this event. This event is not open to the public. If a visitor wishes to participate, they must be accompanied by a Springs Resident at all times. Date/Time to be selected.

Motion: Chris Culbertson made a motion to allow a members only garage sale, one time in October for a short period of time (10:00-4pm). Sherri Barwick seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

Adults Only Soiree: Austin Beeghly presented the Board with a concept of an adults only evening to be hosted at the Club house. The event will have music, wine/beer, appetizers. The event will be planned for a November evening. The event will need to be capped at 90 people conform with Club house usage restrictions.

Motion: Jerry Alexandrowicz made a Motion to host the Adults Only Soiree one evening in November from 6pm until 9pm. The Motion was seconded by Mim Starr and it passed unanimously.

BINGO: Austin Beeghly presented the Board with a concept of hosting a BINGO game within the community. The Association's Attorney (Arias) has provided the necessary regulations that the Board must follow should the game occur.

Motion: Sherri Barwick to approve the expenditure of up to \$500.00 for the Association to purchase the necessary equipment to host the Bingo games. The Motion was seconded by Mim Starr and it passed unanimously.

Rosh Hashannah Observance: In late September, the Jewish community observes Rosh Hashannah. In the Springs a prayer service is held at the spring, led by Rabbi Kancher. The association has received a request to hold the service on September 30, 2019 beginning at 5pm and concluding by 5:30pm.

Motion: Jerry Crews made a motion to approve the request to host Rosh Hashannah service on September 30, 2019. The Motion was seconded by Austin Beeghly and it passed unanimously.

Waste Connections Contract: The Board discussed options it has for trash removal. The current contract expires in June 2020. Waste Connections has requested a new 3 year contract. The Board is not prepared to sign a new 3 year contract without further examination of different companies, including Waste Management as a possible alternative source.

Gate Services and Cameras: Austin Beeghly presented the Board with information concerning possible new service offerings available. Access Control Technologies (ACT)'s product was demonstrated. This offering will automate many of the paper copy actions currently in place at the guard house. A Beeghly also described offering from Florida Door Solutions for gate repair and maintenance. FDS has 11 service technicians crews available. They also maintain a minimum inventory of 15 loaner gates which can be made available while the permanent gate is being repaired.

Representatives of these companies have been requested during the September Board Meeting.

Discussion of Men's and Women's Spa Renovation: The Board conducted a discussion of possible renovation options to consider. No actions/votes taken.

Insurance Renewal: It is time for the insurance policies to begin their annual renew process. The first to renew is the Crime and Wrap policy. A short discussion of the renewal procedure was conducted.

Board Vacancy: Gary Roux has submitted his resignation from the Board of Directors effective August 18, 2019. The Board will discuss options to fill the vacancy during the September Board Meeting.

ADJOURNMENT: There being no further business to discuss, the meeting was adjourned at 8:30pm.

Administrative Oversight on Infrastructure Projects

- Woodbridge Bridge Renovations: Base work around the bridges remains on hold until the rainy season ends. A.P. Wilson has begun fabricating the new bridge rail system. Planned install during mid to late August. The manager filed the required Notice of Commencement for the Bridge Railing Project and fabrication of the steel railings in July. Brinton Tree Service cut down the palm adjacent to the current wood railing so the new 40-ft sections can be lowered into place on August 13th. The Board reviewed the sample bridge cap cross section and paint color. After reviewing the first paint color the Board selected a more brown color, Rustic Red SW7593.
- Road Repairs: B & D Enterprises' proposal to restore the existing 235 foot 36" corrugated pipe with Thermoform PVC Liner (\$42,595) is the only existing bid at this time. Sam's Heavy Equipment Service proposal to line the same pipe with inter-connected 10-ft sections of SnapTite slip-line (\$35,000) has been withdrawn. Sam Flowers indicated that the cost to add the additional 110 feet would lift his bid to about \$65,000. His process would also require more cutting through the road to install a junction box. At the July meeting, Don Hess of B & D indicated he would use GPR (ground penetrating radar) to determine the extent of the void beneath Bridlewood (between the pipe and asphalt layer) so he could revise his bid to address the void following repair of the pipeline.
- Drain Repair: Awaiting a call-back today from hydrology engineer Bob Hrabovsky for his opinion about the efficacy of the thermo plastic liner.
- Clubhouse Area Fence: The Seminole County Planning Dept variance hearing on July 22 resulted in approval of the fence height variance the SCA requested. The manager has filed additional documents required by the county so that Butler Ridge Develop ment can complete the permit request.
- Village-on-the-Green Development: Scott Brooke from Seminole County met with the Board president and the manager to dis cuss the commencement of ground clearing for the Village on the Green expansion project. The project is estimated to last 1 year. Construction activities will be Monday thru Friday. Weekend work is possible, but it will not utilize heavy equipment. Developer WGI is abiding by the buffer requirements required by the Springs.
- Shrub Screening of Springside Road Walls: Fred Mioducki completed the installation of the previously approved planting of a hedge consisting of 90 7-gal Viburnum for a total of \$5683.50. The installation, completed on Tuesday August 13th, will be watered by a bubbler irrigation system installed by Sam Flowers, and should soon block the view of unsightly walls.
- Speed bumps placed at the resident gate have virtually eliminated malfunction of the gates. Only once during the month has someone managed to run into the gate arms, a result of poor driving skills.
- The speed bump on Woodbridge will be replaced by an asphalt bump and relocated to a point higher on the hill, above Bridgeway Ct. Seminole Asphalt Paving will be repositioning of the speed bump on August 20th. Several asphalt speed bumps on Springs Blvd will also be re-worked to provide more effective speed control.
- The manager met with Justyna Niewiadomski, who serves as an arbor consultant on the ACC, and Brad Smith of Budget Tree Service. Budget Tree Service has been re-hired for 3 successive 3-yr contacts by the City of Winter Park to care for their heritage oaks and also has contracts with the cities of Maitland and Oviedo, Seminole County, and Siemens Corporation. Mr. Smith will under take two small oak trimming projects to display their skills. The firm is willing to coordinate care for all of the common area oak canopy and also assist with a tree care education program for the SCA's home owners.

Administrative Projects:

- Arias/Bosinger is working on two Cease and Desist letters to be sent to owners who have caused issues at the front gate and with the guards.
- Seminole County attorney David Shields informed the manager that the SCSO Traffic Enforcement Agreement is being rewritten to incorporate changes in place since it was originally developed about 15 years ago. The new agreement will also deny a designation for the use of golf carts by private owners in the SCA community

Buildings & Grounds

Recreation Area -the spring, basketball court, playground, clubhouse lawn

- SCA Maintenance Staff:
 - Weekly cleaning of the spring
 - Blower sweep of clubhouse veranda, dance circle, sidewalks
 - Removed mud from the tennis court and parking lot area

The following information is taken from Springs Operating Policy No. 14 Architectural Review Committee Construction Criteria

For a copy of the complete Application and Policy, Please Contact the Business Office

The Springs Community Association's (SCA) Declaration of Covenants and Restrictions provide for the review, by committee, of any and all phases of exterior modifications to lots and/or living units within The Springs Planned Unit Development (PUD). This includes but is not limited to painting, roofing, paving, landscaping, fencing, and additions to or deletions from existing structures. The intent of the overall community scheme is to insure a standard of construction, which, over the years, will enhance the appearance of the community as a whole. Each structure and lot upon which it sits is to be considered an element of the community and should blend appropriately with its surroundings. It is intended that this development maintains itself with as many natural surfaces as possible.

REVIEW

The following documents and criteria are established for review by the ACC prior to commencement of any phase of construction. Plans are requested seven days in advance of the regularly scheduled meeting of the ACC so that the site may be reviewed by committee members prior to the meeting. The General Manager will provide approvals, disapprovals, or requests for additional information in writing.

An "Architectural Review" application form describing work to be done submitted with drawings and documents or survey as required.

Must have written sub-association approval (if applicable).

Plans for structures will be not less than 1/8" = 1' scale.

Drawings and documents required for review shall consist of the following:

- Survey prepared by a Florida registered surveyor. Additions such as decks, porches, rooms, pools require a survey showing placement of these structures.
- Site plan showing all lot dimensions, easements, outlines, setbacks, major trees over 6" in diameter, fences, existing and proposed topographic conditions, and underground trench locations at a scale of not less than 1"=20'.
- Floor plans
- Elevations of all sides of contemplated structure. Height limitations in single-family residences will be 2.5 stories or 35 feet.
- A summary specification list of proposed materials. Samples must be supplied for all exterior materials, which cannot be adequately described.
- Color samples for all proposed exterior materials.
- Landscape plans complete with a tree survey.

Approvals will be good for six months unless otherwise specified.

Any permits required by Seminole County must be obtained before contractor's passes are issued. All contractors must be properly licensed and insured.

SUMMARY

The property owner is responsible for and is fully expected to control noise and unsightliness (to include any and all debris) during all phases of construction. The property owner and contractors will provide dust abatement and erosion control measures. Construction is prohibited on Sundays and limited to daylight hours on every other day of the week. Respect for neighboring properties and the rights of other property owners is fully expected.


SCA COLLECTIONS POLICY

THE SPRINGS COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION, INC. ASSESSMENT COLLECTION POLICY AND PROCEDURES RESTATED OCTOBER 2018

- The annual assessment is due on January 1 of each year and delinquent if payment is not received within 30 days.
- A statement and payment coupon are provided at the beginning of the assessment year to the address on record at the SCA business office. Address corrections must be made in writing.
- Monthly statements are provided thereafter which will reflect payments received and interest assessed on any balance.
- Members may elect to pay the annual assessment in installments semi-annually (January 1 and July 1) or quarterly (January 1, April 1, July 1, October 1), with interest charged on the unpaid balance.
- Installment payments are due on the first day of the month of the installment plan elected and become delinquent after 30 days.
- If an installment payment becomes delinquent, the entire unpaid balance of the annual assessment may be accelerated and will be immediately due and payable.
- During any period of delinquency, the membership rights of the delinquent owner and his/her household, to include the use of recreational facilities and voting rights, shall be suspended.
- Interest at the rate of 18% APR will be applied to all balances. Interest assessed to the account is to be paid with the next installment payment.
- If payments are not received within 45 days of the date due, a Notice of Intent to Lien is sent to the owner.
- If payment is not received within 90 days of the date due, a lien is recorded against the property.
- If the account remains delinquent after a lien has been filed, the account may be referred to the Association's attorney for collection action.
- Hardship payment plans submitted in writing will be considered by the Board of Directors, however, collection activities listed above will still apply to protect the interest of the Association. Costs related to all collection activity is the responsibility of the property owner.



I will be walking with my two sisters and the rest of my family to honor my mother's memory. I would love for you to join us. And yes, I'd love a donation, too. Or you can form your own team to honor a friend of loved one who has been ravaged by this insidious disease. Yes raising money is important, but just as important is the need to raise awareness.
